The Almoner's Post



Greetings in the bonds of the Order from the Provincial Almoner, and with the hope that you all had an enjoyable Summer, although some of us are still on a quest for some sunshine with our holidays before us. I am sure we are all looking forward to enjoying our preceptories again and visiting around our Province. I look forward to seeing you.

Anxiety is a tremendous problem in our society. Added to the normal things in our daily lives and the future we have a world which seems to have so much conflict and threats to the future. We have the continuing problems of the Ukraine and the threats and actions of Russia, not just to the Ukraine but to the western world.

We have the problems of the middle East and what seems to be an ever-expanding threat there, centred so much around Israel, Gaza and now the Western Bank.

Many of you may know that as Clergy, Sue and I have led a number of Visits to the Holy Land, as we used to call them 'Following in the Footsteps of Jesus'. We would visit all of the well-known places, Jerusalem, Nazareth, Bethlehem, Bethany, Cana of Galilee, Capernaum, the Sea of Galilee, Jericho, and so much more. Even when we were there, a decade ago, it was never easy and always our Israeli guide checking

ahead with their security services that it was safe to visit. I recall on one occasion walking around the walls of Jerusalem and tuning a corner to see a squad of Israeli soldiers with automatic rifles at the ready on a roof watching the marketplace below, in case of trouble. But it was always a wonderful place to visit and we always felt safe. A place that as Christians we all want to visit, but beware what is said if you visit the Holy Land once you will always want to return.

But from our knowledge and first-hand experience of the Holy Land the situation in Gaza and now the Western Bank, every news report leaves us upset, concerned, even devastated from what we see. The



total devastation of homes, schools, hospitals, so many deaths and suffering.

The holy land of course is not large, which makes it even more of a problem. Indeed! Bethlehem, Bethany, Jericho, Hebron are in the West Bank. Nazareth is under an hours drive north of the West Bank and the sea of Galilee a little further and even closer to the borders of Lebanon. The Northwestern side of the Dead Sea is in the West bank. The Distance from Jerusalem to Gaza is around 50 miles.

We would visit the wedding Chapel at Cana of Galilee and a little story which perhaps puts anxiety into perspective. After visiting the chapel you are ushered into the gift shop just oppo-site. You are invited to taste the wedding wine (to be avoided at all costs) but one guest after tasting the wine said to their guide. 'Is this wine from the time of Jesus' to everyone's surprise, the guide answered, "Yes, in fact, this wine is from the time of Jesus Christ be-cause now is the time of Jesus Christ. He is not dead, he is risen."

Words of recognition perhaps for each of us in times of anxiety and worry for our world. This is the Prince of Peace. A reminder to hold in our prayers the Holy Land and its people. As we do this of course remembering the great Charity as well that we support working in the midst of all these problems, The St John of Jerusalem Eye hospital. The March 2024 Newslet-ter outlined their current work at that time and clinics active in so many places of these lands and the wonderful work that they do.
